## Workshop Content



### Day One: The Current Situation

The first day is typically run as a half-day in the afternoon. The purpose is to understand the current situation with contributions from experts within the Ministry of Education and associated specialists. This agenda includes:

- The objectives and structure of the workshop.
- An assessment of the issues and successes within the country's education system.
- A discussion of Promethean's Education Transformation Framework and the six Themes That Matter: Teacher Effectiveness, Data Driven Decision Making, Student Achievement, Assessment, Education Continuum and Curriculum Development.



### Day Two: The Themes That Matter

On the second day the delegates begin to use the conclusions of the first day's discussion about the Themes That Matter to identify the areas in the education system they want to focus on. In six breakout groups they discuss each of the Themes That Matter in order to identify the top two or three issues in each area, and the country-specific complications or barriers that prevent those issues being solved within their education system.

The groups reconvene and create a matrix of all the issues they have identified (usually 12 - 16 in total). Then all the delegates vote on what they feel to be the most urgent ones.

### Day Three: Building a Prototype

On the third day the delegates focus on the two or three top issues identified in the breakout groups on day two. Working in small groups they create ideal, practical scenarios that would solve, or demonstrate a partial solution to, the problems they chose. These scenarios can then be used to build a prototype system that will be tested and refined on a small scale, in order to create the blueprint for a scalable and sustainable solution.
